# I might as well have been drinking Drano ... that's how much I was abusing my body with alcohol

y name is Tina, and I can tell you one thing. I was dead set against ever wearing someone else's clothes — and that's what I knew I'd get if I came to a rescue mission. I felt I was too good for such an indignity. I also promised myself I wouldn't last three months here.

Well, if there is crow to be eaten, I'm eating it. Coming to Chattanooga Rescue Mission saved my life. I had abused alcohol and other drugs for 30 years. People would call my dad and say, "I don't think Tina is breathing." I was one step away from living on the streets, which would have killed my mother. "Out there," I might as well have drunk Drano. That's how bad it got for me. When I was drinking, I didn't know what I was doing. I was hateful, angry and someone you wouldn't want to spend much time with.

## I'm thankful to God, the Mission and to you for your kindness

Now I wear your donated clothes with pride, and I've lasted here at the Mission a lot longer than three months. This has all happened because of my relationship with God, the compassion of the Mission staff and your generosity as a donor. I never thought I would ever leave my old life behind — which was nothing but a black hole in the bottom

I had a choice between life and death; I thank God I chose life. of the ocean. Today, I live in peace and am slowly becoming the person God created me to be.

I know this holiday season will be a good one for me, because of who I'm becoming. I'm so glad God and the Mission have given me a second chance at life. And I thank you again for your kindness and compassion.
